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RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE NINTH SESSION OF TENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The summons for the Ninth Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued on 6-1-1999. The session commenced at 5.00 p.m. on Friday, January 22, 1999 and adjourned sine-die at 4.45 p.m. on March 1, 1999. There were altogether Twenty-three sittings. The House transacted business for 137 hrs. 30 minutes.

Governor's Address:

The Governor addressed the Members of the Legislative Assembly at Thanks to the Governor's Address was commenced on January 25, 1999 with Shri T. Nasroo Master moving the following motion:

Leave of absence from sittings of the House:

On March 1, 1999 the House granted leave to Shri N. Sundararajan Nadar to remain absent from the sittings of the Current Session of the Assembly.

Motion for extension of time:

On February 11, 1999 Shri K. P. Jainal, Minister for Revenue moved that the time for the presentation of the Report of the Select Committee on the Revenue Card Bill, 1997 be extended till February 11, 1999 and the same was adopted by the House.

Announcements by the Speaker:

On February 18, 1999 the Speaker informed the House that R. S. Unni, Ex-Deputy Speaker and who was in charge of the Speaker for ten months has expired. He further announced that business of the House stand adjourned for the day to enable the members to pay homage to the deceased.

Statement under Rule 300:

On January 25, 1999 the Chief Minister made statements under Rule 300, one of the tragedy occurred in Parbat during Sabarimala Pilgrimage and other expressing concern on the increasing atrocities against the minorities in various parts of the country.

On January 29, 1999, the Chief Minister made a statement under Rule 300 demanding the Central Government to reconsider the enhancement of prices of rice, sugar and wheat distributed through ration shops. Leader of Opposition also made a mention under Rule 300, urging the withdrawal of hike announced by Government of India in the price of Rice, Wheat, Sugar and Urea.

The following motion was then adopted by the House unanimously:

On February 25, 1999, Minister for Industries and Social Welfare made a statement under Rule 300 regarding the Public Enterprises under the Central of Industries Department and also laid on the Table the white paper regarding the Public Enterprises under the Control of Industries Department.

Statement by Leader of Opposition:

On February 15, 1999 the Leader of Opposition stated that members of the Opposition Parties were going to take part in the Railway Station picketing in protest against the price hike of ration commodities.

Motion under Rule 130:

On February 4, 1999 Shri K. M. Mani moved the following motion under Rule 130:

On March 1, 1999 the Speaker withheld consent to the following notices of question of breach of privilege given under Rule 155:

(1) Notice given by Shri K. K. Ramachandran Master against Shri Manoj Abraham, A. S. P., Adoor, alleging that the latter had beaten up Shri Thiruvanchoor Radhakrishnan and Shri Adoor Prakash while they were on a hunger strike along with the U.D.F. Workers at Gandhi Tower in the Central Maidan, Adoor on March 5, 1997.

(2) Notice given by Shri K. A. Chandran against the Excise Inspector and Police Inspector, Thiruvalla alleging that a Criminal case had been charged against Mammon Mathai, Member from Thiruvalla Constituency.

(3) Notice given by Shri K. A. Chandran against Shri V. G. K. Menon, President, Travancore Devaswam Board based on a report with title "മലബാറിലെ മുൻസിപ്പൽ കൗൺസിൽ കൂട്ടായിരുന്നു" published in Mathrubhumi Daily on January 19, 1998.

(b) The Speaker informed the House that the following notices are under the consideration of the Chair:

(1) Notice given by Shri Thiruvanchoor Radhakrishnan against the Chief Minister alleging that the latter had violated the ruling of the Speaker in the House on August 3, 1998 regarding the indecent behaviour of the Sub Inspector, Ezhukone towards Shri Ezhukone Narayanan.

(2) Notice given by Shri Johny Nelloor against the Minister for Fisheries and Rural Development alleging that the answer given to the unanswered question No. 840 dated 1-2-1999 regarding the State drama award distribution was incorrect.

(3) Notice given by Shri K. A. Chandran against the Director General of Police and six other Police officers alleging that they had acted against protocol by not inviting Shri P. P. Thankachan to the inauguration of the newly constructed building of Kodanad Police Station in Perumbavoor Constituency.

(4) Notice given by Shri E. M. Augusthy against the Minister for Education and Works alleging that the answer given by the latter to the unanswered question No. 3243 dated February 18, 1999 was incorrect.

(5) The Speaker informed the House that the notice given by Smt. Rosamma Chacko against the Sub Inspector, Kodakara alleging that the latter had misbehaved with the member while she was travelling in a car to Thrissur to take part in an official function on February 6, 1999 was referred to the Privileges Committee for its consideration.

IV. Reference of Bill to Select Committee

The Kerala Co-operative Societies (Amendment) Bill, 1999 was introduced in the House on 26-2-1999 and was referred to a Select Committee on the same day. 7 members including the Minister for Electricity and Co-operation participated in the general discussion on the Bill. The Assembly devoted 45 minutes for the discussion.

V. Presentation of Select Committee Report

The Report of the Select Committee on the Kerala Revenue Card Bill, 1997 was presented on 11-2-1999.

Financial Business

1. Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1998-99

On February 12, 1999, the Minister for Finance laid on the Table the Supplementary Financial Statement for the year 1998-99. Discussion and Voting on the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1998-99 took place on 16th February 1999. 17 members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion. The Assembly devoted 4 hours and 30 minutes altogether for the discussion and voting on the Supplementary Grants and Excess Grants.

The Kerala Appropriation Bill, 1999 in respect of the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1998-99 was introduced in the House by the Minister for Finance on 17th February, 1999. The Bill was taken into consideration and passed on the same day. 12 members participated in the discussion. The Assembly devoted 2 hours and 20 minutes altogether for the passing of the six Appropriation Bills.

2. Demands for Excess Grants

On February 12, 1999, the Minister for Finance laid on the Table the Statements of Excess Grants for the years 1983-84, 1985-86, 1986-87, 1987-88 and 1988-89. Discussion and voting took place on 16th February, 1999.

The Kerala Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1999, The Kerala Appropriation (No. 3) Bill, 1999, The Kerala Appropriation (No. 4) Bill, 1999, The Kerala Appropriation (No. 5) Bill, 1999 and the Kerala Appropriation (No. 6) Bill, 1999, in respect of the Excess Grants were introduced, taken into consideration and passed on 17th February, 1999.

Private Members' Business

According to the Calendar of Sittings of the Ninth Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly Private Members' business was set down for four days, viz. January 29, February 5, 12 and 19, 1999. But, as per the 19th Report of the B.A.C. the time allotted for Private Members' business on February 19, 1999 has been reallocated for Government business. Hence, total number of days got for Private Members business was reduced to three. Out of the three days January 29 and February 12 were set apart for Private Members' Bills and February 5 for Private Members' Resolutions.

A. Private Members' Bills

During the Session 13 motions for leave to introduce bills have come up before the House. All the bills were opposed by the ministers concerned. Discussion on all the bills was inconclusive. Besides, discussion was resumed on seven pending Bills. Out of them discussion was completed on two bills.

Details regarding the name of members who moved the motion for leave to introduce the bills and the result thereof are given in Appendix VIII - IX.

B. Private Members' Resolution

During the Session notice was given for three resolutions by Shri M. Narayanan (Coyalmanam), Shri A. K. Monty and Shri G. Sudhakaran (authorised by Shri Elamaram Kareem) respectively. But the resolution of Shri A. K. Monty was not moved due to the absence of the member. Discussion on the resolution of Shri P. S. Supal which was moved in the previous session and left inconclusive, was continued and finally all the three resolutions were passed unanimously.

7. The Travancore-Cochin Hindu Religious Institutions (Amendment) Bill, 1999

1. Section 4 of the Travancore-Cochin Hindu Religious Institutions Act, 1950 (XV of 1950) provides that Travancore Devaswom Board shall consist of 3 Hindu members, two of whom shall be nominated by the Hindus among the Council of Ministers and one elected by the Hindu members in the Legislative Assembly of the State. There is similar provision in section 63 of the Act in respect of the Cochin Devaswom Board also. The said Act also insists that the Hindu Members of the Council of Ministers and the Hindu Members of the Legislative Assembly who participate in the nomination or election, as the case may be, of the member of the Board shall be persons who believe in God and temple worship and such Ministers or the members of the Legislative Assembly shall deliver a declaration to that effect before making the nomination or participating in the election.

2. Sub-section (aa) under section 2 and sub-section (4A), under section 61 defines 'the Hindu' as a person who is a Hindu by birth or by conversion into Hindu religion and professes the Hindu religion and believes in God and temple worship.

3. Government considered that the person who is nominated or elected as a member of the Devaswom Board shall be a Hindu who believes in God and temple worship. It was also considered fair to give opportunity to all Hindu members of the Council of Ministers and all Hindu members of the Legislative Assembly who profess the Hindu Religion to participate in the nomination or election without insisting on giving a declaration to the effect that they believe in God and temple worship.

4. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposals had to be given effect to immediately, the Travancore-Cochin Hindu Religious Institutions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998 was promulgated by the Governor on the 14th day of December, 1998 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 18 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 2047 dated the 15th December, 1998.

5. The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

2. The Kerala Lok Ayukta Bill, 1999

In pursuance of the declared policy of the State Government to eliminate corruption in public service, it has become necessary to strengthen the existing vigilance machinery in the State. Government considered that the Kerala Public Men's Corruption (Investigations and Inquiries) Act, 1987 in force in the State, was not sufficient to prevent, effectively, the corruption among public servants. Government considered it necessary to widen the ambit of the legislation by including all the Government servants, the members and the person in service of the local authority, statutory and non-statutory bodies and co-operative societies within the purview of the same. Therefore, it has been decided to bring forth a comprehensive new legislation for the effective inquiry and investigation of complaints against public servants and matters connected therewith or ancillary thereto.

2. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Lok Ayukta Ordinance, 1998 was promulgated by the Governor on the 15th day of November, 1998, after obtaining instructions from the President of India, and the same was published as Ordinance No. 16 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1870 dated the 15th November, 1998.

3. The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

4. The notes on clauses appended to the Bill explain the various provisions in the Bill.

13. The Kerala General Sales Tax (Amendment) Bill, 1998

Sub-sections (6) and (8) of section 17 of the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 (15 of 1963) prescribe a time limit of four years from the end of the financial year in which the assessment comes for the completion of original assessment and a period of four years from the end of the financial year in which the order giving rise to re-assessment is received, for the completion of re-assessment under the said Act. But in the case of assessments relating to the period upto and including the year 1993-94 and in the case of re-assessments in respect of which the order of the Appellate or revisional authority giving rise to such re-assessment received upto and including the year 1993-94, the time was extended upto the 30th day of September, 1998, by the amendment made to sub-sections (6) and (8) of section 17 of the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963, by the Kerala Finance Act, 1998 (14 of 1998) [viz section 3 (3) (b) and (3)].

2. Though almost all the cases falling under the above categories have been completed, there are few cases which could not be completed since the assessment records in respect of which are held up in the office of the Advocate General and in the office of the statutory authorities in connection with certain Original Petitions pending before court or other statutory proceedings pitting before such authorities. Such cases would be barred by limitation and revenue involved in such cases may be lost unless the time limit in respect of such cases are not extended further.

3. By the Kerala Finance Act, 1998 (14 of 1998) the word "Horlicks, Boost, Bournvita, Complan" appearing in Serial No. 87 of the First Schedule to the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 were omitted by mistake [vide section 3(17) (viii)]. Government had not intended to grant any concession in the rate of tax on these commodities. Concession in the rate of tax was announced only in respect of non-alcoholic drinks and beverages manufactured by Small Scale Industrial Units within the State (rate of 10% of which was reduced from 20% to 10%). Deletion of the said item from Serial No. 87 will cause revenue loss to the Government.

4. To therefore re-introduce all the items 'above and following' the year 1993-94 from the 30th day of September, 1998 to the 31st day of March, 1999 and also to re-introduce the items Horlicks, Boost, Bournvita and Complan in Serial No. 87 in the First Schedule to Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963.

5. Amendment to the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963, was necessary to give effect to the above proposals.

6. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposals had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala General Sales Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998 was promulgated by the Governor on the 29th day of September, 1998 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 13 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1575 dated the 29th September, 1998.

7. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 13 of 1998 by an Act of the State Legislature.
