**RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE SEVENTH  
SESSION OF THE TENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY**

The summons for the Seventh Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued to Members on 27-2-1998. The Session commenced at 9.00 am. on Friday, March 13, 1998 and adjourned sine die at 1.45 pm. on Thursday, April, 23, 1998. There were altogether twenty-two sittings. The House transacted business for 116 Hrs. 20 Minutes.

*Governor's Address:*

The Governor addressed the Members of the Legislative Assembly at 9.00 am. on March 13, 1998. The discussion on the Motion of Thanks to moving the following motion:

The Discussion continued on March 17 and 18 and the Motion of Thanks was adopted on March 18, 1998. The Governor's reply to the Motion of Thanks was reported to the House on March 26, 1998. Consequent on the demise of E. M. Sankaran Namboothirippad, the presentation of the Budget scheduled on 20 March 1998 was deferred to March 24, 1998.

*Obituary Reference:*

On March 23, 1998 the Speaker made reference on the demise of E. M. Sankaran Namboothirippad, former Chief Minister. As a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased the House adjourned for the day.

On April 23, 1998 the Speaker made references regarding the demise of M. K. Hemachandran, M. C. Abraham, G. Varadan and K. S. Narayanan Namboodiri, former members of Kerala Legislative Assembly and Dr. M. O. Cherian, former Member, Travancore-Cochin Legislative Assembly.

On April 17, 1998, Speaker expressed condolence on the death of nine persons and injury to many others in the incident of fire that occurred in a factory at Kanjicode near Palakkad on 16-4-1998.

*Statements under Rule 300:*

On March 18, 1998 Chief Minister made a statement under Rule 300 regarding the extension of time for the utilisation of funds by the local bodies till June 30, 1998.

On March 19, 1998, Chief Minister made a statement under Rule 300 about the distribution of free ration to the Fishermen for two weeks.

On April 16, 1998, Chief Minister made a statement under Rule 300 regarding the problems that may arise consequent on the new import policy of the Central Government.

*Announcement by the Speaker:*

On March 18, 1998, the Speaker informed the House that, as per the decision taken at the meeting of the leaders of parties held on 17-3-1998 the number of submission will be limited to six per day and that, the time in between 10.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m. will only be allotted for party-wise discussion.

On March 24, 1998, the Speaker informed the House that as per the decision of the Business Advisory Committee the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Bill, 1998 would be introduced and the Motion for reference to Subject Committee would be taken up on March 25, 1998 and that the General Discussion on the Budget would also commence on that day.

*Motion under Rule 130:*

On April 2, 1998, Sri E. M. Augusthy moved the following motion under Rule 130:

After discussion and reply by Sri V.P. Ramakrishna Pillai, Minister for Irrigation and Labour Sri T. M. Jacob moved the following substantive motion under Rule 275:

Sri V. P. Ramakrishna Pillai, Minister for Irrigation and Labour also moved the following substantive motion under Rule 275:

The motion moved by Sri T. M. Jacob was put to vote and declared lost. Then the motion moved by Sri V. P. Ramakrishna Pillai, Minister for Irrigation and Labour was unanimously adopted by the House.

*III. Reference of Bills to Subject Committees and Presentation of Subject Committee Reports:*

The Kerala Revenue Card Bill, 1997 was introduced in the House on 23-4-1998 and was referred to a Select Committee on the same day.

*V. Circulation of Bill to elicit public Opinion:*

The Kerala Hindu Religion and Charitable Substitutions and Endowments Bill, 1997 which was introduced in the House on 23-12-1997 was circulated for eliciting public opinion for 45 days on 23-4-1998.

### **Financial Business**

*I. Budget:*

On March 24, 1998, the Minister for Finance presented the Budget for the financial year 1998-99. General Discussion on the Budget took place on 25th, 26th and 27th of March 1998. 49 members including the Deputy Speaker and Minister for Finance participated in the discussion.

II. *The Kerala Appropriation Vote on Account Bill, 1998:*

The Minister for Finance introduced the Vote on Account Bill on 30th March 1998 and was passed on the same day. 19 members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion.

III. *The Kerala Appropriation Bill, 1998:*

The Kerala Appropriation Bill, 1998 relating to the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 1997-98 was introduced by the Minister for Finance in the House on 26th March 1998 and was passed on the same day. 7 members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion.

**Private Members' Business**

According to the Calendar of Sitting of the Seventh Session of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, the Private Members' Business was set down for two days, viz., 27th March and 3rd April, 1998. Out of the above days 27th March was allotted to Private Members Bills and 3rd April was set apart for Private Members' Resolutions. On 27th March, the Private Members' Bills was not taken since the Government pursued the Budget discussions on the allotted day. The Assembly was extended up to April 23, 1998 and in addition a day was allotted to Private Members' Bills and Resolutions i.e. April 17, 1998.

*A. Private Members' Resolutions:*

During the Current Session notices for four resolutions in total were received from Shri G. Sudhakaran (already taken up in the Assembly but not concluded), Shri John Fernandez, Shri P. Raju and Shri Elamaram Karim. Of these, only two resolutions were taken up for discussion in the Assembly. The details regarding the names of members who moved the resolutions, the text of resolutions and the result thereof are given in Appendix VIII.

A statement showing the number of members who gave notice of their intention to move the resolutions, the number of resolutions discussed and time taken for discussion etc. are given in Appendix IX.

*B. Private Members' Bills:*

During the Session, discussion on the motion of 2 Bills were concluded. Fifteen Bills were introduced. Details regarding the names of Bills and the names of members, time taken for discussion and the result thereof are given in Appendix X.



The House devoted a total period of 3 hours and 21 minutes for transacting Private Members' Business. 21 members participated in the discussion of Private Members' Resolutions.

## APPENDIX VI

## SALIENT FEATURES OF IMPORTANT BILLS

**The Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Bill, 1970**

Numerous proceedings are pending before the Land Tribunals, the Taluk Land Boards, the State Land Board, the Courts or the Revenue Authorities or other authorities wherein small holders and cultivating tenants who purchased or otherwise acquired land for consideration, evidenced by registered document or otherwise are under threat of eviction or dispossession, on the ground that the lands so purchased or acquired by them are excess land to be surrendered under the provisions of the Kerala Land Reforms Act, 1963.

2. There have been persistent demands from the general public and organisations to protect such small holders and cultivating tenants who had bonafidely purchased such land from eviction or dispossession.

3. Such demands had been under consideration of the Government and the Government are examining the feasibility of enacting a legislation to provide for the protection of their rights and interests on such lands. However, pending enactment of a legislation, Government consider it necessary in the public interest, to provide temporary protection to such small holders and cultivating tenants who had purchased lands which are subsequently found as excess land to be surrendered under the provisions of Kerala Land Reforms Act, 1963, from the threat of eviction from, or dispossession of, such land. The temporary protection is intended only for a period of one year during which period it is proposed to amend the provisions of the Kerala Land Reforms Act, 1963, suitably to protect their rights and interest on such land, permanently.

4. The Bill is intended to achieve the above object.

**THE KERALA APPROPRIATION BILL, 1970**

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the Grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the financial year, 1970-71.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (VOTE ON ACCOUNT)  
BILL, 1998

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of article 204(1) of the Constitution of India, read with article 206 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund and the grants made in advance by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for a part of the Financial Year 1998-99.

THE KERALA REVOCATION OF ARBITRATION CLAUSES  
AND REOPENING OF AWARDS BILL, 1998

The Kallada Irrigation Project is the biggest Irrigation Project in Kerala. It was started in 1961. The total cost as estimated then was Rs. 13.28 crores and a loan and credit agreement was executed with the World Bank for financing the project. A special condition envisaged by the World Bank namely, the local competitive bidding specification as approved by the World Bank authorities and sanctioned by Government vide G.O. (Ms) No. S/81/I&R. dated 20-1-1981 was included in the agreement as clauses 51 and 52 which envisages the settlement of disputes through arbitration. The agreement with the World Bank was terminated with effect from 31-3-1989. But most of the local competitive bidding contract works are yet to be completed and such contracts include arbitration clauses. Even though the original sanctioned estimate for the project was Rs. 13.28 crores, the amounts so far expended on account of this comes to Rs. 457 crores. Most of the contractors who took contract works under local competitive bidding used to move for arbitration. Very huge exorbitant and unaccountable amounts were awarded by the Sole Arbitrators based on flimsy grounds, disregarding the conditions of contract. The defence and counter claims of the Department based on technical and legal grounds were not being considered or admitted by the arbitrators. When the awards were challenged in the Courts by the respondents, the courts also overruled the contentions of the Department and decrees were passed in terms of the award. These findings of the courts facilitated a trend of awarding very huge amounts by the Arbitrators. Government have already paid Rs. 19.81 crores to satisfy 146 arbitration claims and that a further amount of Rs. 19.65 crores would be required to meet 142 claims now pending before the sub-courts. Further, there are 53 claims for over Rs. 17.17 crores are now pending before arbitrators. As such the total liability on arbitration claims would come to over 60 crores excluding interest. Reckoning interest also for total liability would be very huge. The World Bank stopped their assistance from October, 1989. Now, the entire expenditure is being met by the State, from plan schemes. If this is allowed to be continued further, several taxes are likely to come up which will finally lead to losses of several hundred crores of rupees to the State exchequer.

2. In order to overcome the situation it was decided to enact a new legislation to provide for the cancellation of arbitration clauses in agreements executed in terms of the local competitive bidding specification, for revocation of authority of the arbitrators appointed under such agreements and for filing appeals by the Government against awards in respect of which the period of limitation has expired.

3. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Revocation of Arbitration Clauses and Re-opening of Awards Ordinance, 1997 was promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 13th day of November, 1997 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 19 of 1997 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1556 dated the 14th November, 1997.

4. A Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature, though published as Bill No. 107, could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 8th day of December, 1997 and ended on the 23rd day of December, 1997.

5. In order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 19 of 1997 Ordinance, 1998 promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 19th day of January, 1998 was published as Ordinance No. 6 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 107 dated the 19th January, 1998.

6. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 6 of 1998 by an Act of the State Legislature.

#### THE KERALA COIR WORKERS' WELFARE FUND (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1998

On the basis of the recommendations of the three member Committee appointed to suggest amendments to the Kerala Coir Workers' Welfare Fund Act, 1987 and the Rules and Schemes framed thereunder the Government have *inter alia*, decided,—

- (i) to liberalise the existing pension schemes to the coir workers;
- (ii) to introduce a new provision for payment of other retirement benefits to the coir workers;
- (iii) to give an opportunity to the coir workers who could not register their names in the Fund to register their names;
- (iv) to include a worker who works under different establishments or employers (floating worker) in the definition of coir workers;

- (v) to include coir pith in the definition of coir products;
- (vi) to simplify the definition of the term employer;
- (vii) to include fibre from deburring mills also in the definition of the term fibre;
- (viii) to include all activities in connection with the manufacture of coir products in the definition of processes in coir industry;
- (ix) to dispense with the disparity between co-operative and private sector;
- (x) to prescribe a minimum period of ten year's valid membership for eligibility of pension and other retirement benefits;
- (xi) to grant pension to a member who has valid membership for a minimum period of thirty years in the fund;
- (xii) to give family pension to minor children after the death of the member in cases where spouse of the member died earlier;
- (xiii) to insist membership for a minimum period of three years for availing financial assistance from the fund;
- (xiv) to raise the contribution of coir worker and self employed persons from one rupee to five rupees;
- (xv) to raise the matching contribution of the Government to the fund; and
- (xvi) to simplify the contribution of the employer, producers of coir products and exporters to the fund.

2. As the Legislative Assembly was not in Session and as the above proposals had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Coir Workers' Welfare Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1997, was promulgated by the Governor on the 27th day of September, 1997 and published as Ordinance No. 14 of 1997 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1944 dated 30th September, 1997.

3. Through a Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature was published as Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly Bill No. 101, the same could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 8th day of December, 1997 and ended on 23rd day of December, 1997, for want of time.



4. In order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 14 of 1997, the Kerala Coir Workers' Welfare Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998, promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 16th day of January, 1998, was published as Ordinance No. 5 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 88 dated the 16th day of January, 1998.

5. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 5 of 1998 by an Act of the State Legislature.

#### THE KERALA PROHIBITION OF RAGGING BILL, 1997

In the judgement in O.P. No. 11380 of 1991-D, reported in 1992 (2) K.L.T. 476, the High Court of Kerala has expressed the view that the practice of ragging in educational institutions should be viewed as a criminal offence and that the culprits should be prosecuted just like ordinary criminals. It was also held therein that in order to prevent ragging, the police will be justified in entering the premises of educational institutions. In the judgment, the court had also directed that the State and Universities shall require the heads of educational institutions to report all instances involving physical assault in any form, in their knowledge occurring in colleges and hostels to police promptly and without failure.

2. Government have issued Circular instructions, repeatedly, to the Director of Collegiate Education, the Director of Medical Education, the Director of Technical Education and other concerned officers, inviting their attention to the above judgement. However, the executive instructions from the Government did not have the desired effect and incidents of brutal harassment of students in the name of ragging are being reported, even now in the newspapers. Under these circumstances, it was considered necessary to enact a legislation to prohibit ragging in the educational institutions in the State.

3. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the above proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Ordinance, 1997 was promulgated by the Governor on the 23rd day of October, 1997 and published as Ordinance No. 16 of 1997 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1453 dated the 23rd day of October, 1997.

4. This Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

#### THE REGISTRATION (KERALA AMENDMENT) BILL, 1997

According to section 80 of the Registration Act, 1908 (Central Act 16 of 1908), all fees for the Registration of documents shall be payable on the presentation of such documents. Therefore, the amount of fees has to be calculated

on the consideration of value as shown in the document. There is no provision in the Act to recover the fee or the deficiency in fee, subsequently, if on inspection or otherwise it is found that the registration fee payable in relation to a document has not been paid or has been insufficiently paid. Therefore, it is considered necessary to make a provision in the Act for the demand and recovery of the registration fee which escaped realisation.

2. The Bill seeks to amend the Act in its application in this State, for the above purpose.

#### THE KANNUR UNIVERSITY (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1998

As the Kannur University established by the Kannur University Act, 1986 is a new University it will have to appoint sufficient number of non-teaching staff to meet the administrative, academic and educational work related to the Pre-degree courses in the colleges affiliated to that University and on completion of the desisting process of Pre-degree courses from all colleges, these staff will become surplus.

2. In order to avoid the said situation it was proposed that the Pre-degree courses under the Colleges affiliated to the Kannur University be continued to be affiliated to the Calicut University so that the Calicut University can continue to do the work relating to the Pre-degree courses in those colleges as that University has already sufficient staff to meet the requirements. The proposal was agreed to by the Calicut University also.

3. In order to achieve the object, necessary provision for the purpose had to be incorporated in the Kannur University Act, 1986, by suitably amending the Act.

4. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kannur University (Amendment) Ordinance, 1997 was promulgated by the Governor on the 13th day of November, 1997 and was published as Ordinance No. 18 of 1997 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1555 dated the 14th November, 1997.

5. A Bill to replace Ordinance No. 18 of 1997 by an Act of the State Legislature was published as Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly Bill No. 104. But the Bill could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala during its session which commenced on the 8th day of December, 1997 and ended on the 28th day of December, 1997, for want of time.

6. In order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 18 of 1997, the Kannur University (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998, was promulgated

by the Governor of Kerala on the 16th day of January, 1998 and was published as Ordinance No. 1 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 84 dated the 16th January, 1998.

7. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 1 of 1998 by an Act of the State Legislature.

### THE GURUVAYUR DEVASWOM (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1998

According to sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Guruvayur Devaswom Act, 1978 (14 of 1978), the members of the Guruvayur Devaswom Managing Committee nominated under clause (d) or clause (e) of sub-section (1) of section 4 of the said Act shall hold office for a period of two years from the date of their nomination. It was considered necessary to extend the term of office of the said members to four years so as to enable the said Committee to implement properly the projects decided by it.

2. According to clause (c) of sub-section (2) of section 21 of the said Act, every budget shall make adequate provision for the repair and renovation of buildings connected with the Devaswom. But there was no provision in the Act conferring sufficient authority to the Devaswom to undertake construction of new buildings connected with the affairs of the Devaswom. Therefore, it was considered necessary to make provision in the Act to empower the Devaswom to undertake construction of new buildings also connected with the affairs of the Devaswom.

3. According to clauses (e) and (f) of section 27 of the said Act, Devaswom can incur expenditure out of Devaswom Fund for the establishment and maintenance of educational institutions which provide for encouragement of education in Sanskrit Language alone. It was considered necessary to enable the Devaswom to incur expenditure for the establishment and maintenance of educational institutions which provide for encouragement of education in Malayalam language also.

4. Amendment to the Guruvayur Devaswom Act, 1978, was necessary to give effect to the above proposals.

5. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposals had to be give effect to immediately, the Guruvayur Devaswom (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998, was promulgated by the Governor on the 16th day of January, 1998 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 3 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 86 dated the 16th January, 1998.

6. The Bill seeks to replace Ordinance No. 3 of 1998 by an Act of the State Legislature.

## THE KERALA PANCHAYAT RAJ (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1998

As per item 13 (b) of Third Schedule of the Kerala Panchayat Raj Act, 1994, the Village Panchayats have been entrusted to receive applications and to conduct enquiries and recommend for pensions to the widows, aged and for financial assistance for marriage of the daughters of (poor) widows, and for pension for Agricultural labourers and unemployment dole and the District Panchayats have been entrusted as per item 12 (a) of the Fifth Schedule, with the function of the distribution of Social Security Pensions and as per item 16 (2) the distribution of unemployment dole and the Agricultural workers' pension. The division of these functions causes many problems. Since the number of district-wise applications for pension is large, the existing arrangement causes many administrative difficulties and delay in the distribution of pensions. This system has given rise to many hardships as far as the poor beneficiaries are concerned. So the Government have decided to transfer the function of the distribution of the all pensions including unemployment dole from the District Panchayats to Village Panchayats in order to eliminate the above mentioned difficulties. The Government have also decided to distribute these pensions in this manner during this current financial year itself. It is necessary to make amendments in the Kerala Panchayat Raj Act, 1994 in order to implement the above mentioned objective.

2. As the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was not in session and as circumstances existed which rendered it necessary for him to make immediate legislation to implement the above said directions, the Governor of Kerala was pleased to promulgate the Kerala Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Ordinance, 1997 on the 8th day of November 1997 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 17 of 1997 in the Kerala Gazette, Extraordinary No. 1527 dated 10th November 1997.

3. Though a Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature was published as Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly Bill No. 100, the same could not be introduced in and passed by the Legislative Assembly during the session which commenced on the 8th day of December, 1997 and ended on 23rd day of December 1997 for want of time.

4. In the circumstances, in order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 17 of 1997, the Kerala Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Ordinance, 1998 was promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 15th day of January 1998 and published as Ordinance No. 4 of 1998 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 87, dated the 16th January, 1998.

5. The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the Legislative Assembly.
