RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE SECOND SESSION OF THE ELEVENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The summons for the second session of the Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued on September 27, 2001. The session commenced at 9.00 a.m. on Friday, October 12, 2001 and adjourned sine-die at 12.28 p.m. on December 7, 2001. Even though 38 days of sittings were scheduled as per the Calendar, 7 days of sittings were cancelled due to disruption of the proceedings. The House met on the following days viz. October 12, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 22, 23, 24, 29, 30, 31, November 12, 13, 15, 16, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, December 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, 2001 (31 days sittings). The House transacted business for 139 Hrs. and 55 Mins.

Obituary References:

Correction in the Alteration Memorandum:

On October 15, 2001, Shri K. Sankaranarayanan, Minister for Finance and Excise laid on the Table the statement correcting the error on pages 147 and 148 of the Alteration Memorandum to the Original Budget Estimates 2001-2002.

Statement by Chief Minister/Ministers:

On October 31, 2001, Shri K. Sankaranarayanan, Minister for Finance and Excise suggested that the House may be adjourned till November 11, 2001 and the House may meet again on November 12 to consider the motion for reference to Subject Committee of the Kerala Finance Bill, 2001. The House agreed to the above suggestion.

On November 22, 2001, the Chief Minister made a statement correcting the answer given to the B Part of Starred question No. 153 dated July 18, 2001.

Announcements by Hon'ble Speaker:

On October 31, 2001, the Speaker made the following announcement:-

"സമൂഹീയ നിയമ സസംഘർഷ് ചെയ്യപ്പെട്ട മൂന്ന് അംഗങ്ങൾ ഇന്നലെ സഭകക്ഷിയിൽ അനിശ്ചിതകാല നിരവധി സത്യാഗ്രഹം ആരംഭിച്ചിരിക്കുകയാണ്. ഇക്കഴിഞ്ഞ ഒക്ടോബർ 18-ാം തീയതി മുതൽ തുടർച്ചയായി സഭാ നടപടികൾ തടസ്സപ്പെട്ടുകൊണ്ടിരിക്കുകയുമാണ്. സസംഘർഷ് ചെയ്യപ്പെട്ട അംഗങ്ങൾ സഭാപരിസരത്ത് പ്രവേശിക്കുന്നതുപോലും ക്രമവിരുദ്ധമാണെന്നിരിക്കെ സഭാ നിയമസഭയുടെ തീരുമാനത്തിൽ പ്രതിഷേധിച്ചുകൊണ്ട് സഭാകക്ഷിയിൽ സത്യാഗ്രഹമനുഷ്ഠിക്കുന്നത് അക്ഷമവ്യമായ കൃതമാണ്. കേരള നിയമസഭയുടെ ചരിത്രത്തിൽ മുൻപ് ഒരിക്കലും ഇതിന് സമാനമായ ഒരു സംഭവം ഉണ്ടായിട്ടില്ല. ഇത് അത്യന്തം നിർഭാഗ്യകരമായി മാറ്റി എന്ന് ചൂണ്ടിക്കാട്ടാൻ ചെയർമാൻ ആഗ്രഹിക്കുന്നു. നിയമസഭയുടെ മുൻപാകെയുള്ള അന്യായ ധനകാര്യ ബിസിനസ്സുകൾ പൂർത്തിയാക്കുകയെന്ന റേണുലസനോബായുടെ നിർവ്വഹണനിർവ്വഹണ സഭ അംഗീകരിച്ച പ്രവർത്തനങ്ങൾ അടിസ്ഥാനത്തിൽ തുടർന്നുള്ള നടപടികളിലേക്ക് കടക്കുകയാണ്."

On December 3, 2001, the Speaker announced that the official Website of Kerala Legislature (www.niyamasabha.org) will be inaugurated by the Chief Minister at 4.00 p.m.

On December 4, 2001, the Hon'ble Speaker informed that Shri T. M. Jacob, Minister for Irrigation and Water Supply will move the motion under Rule 130 regarding the Mullaperiyar Dam on December 7, 2001 instead of by Shri V. S. Achuthanandan, Leader of Opposition in compliance with the recommendation of the Report of the Business Advisory Committee adopted by the House on 30-11-2001.

Statements under Rule 300:

On October 31, 2001 Shri K. Sankaranarayanan, Minister for Finance and Excise made a statement regarding the serious situation being faced by the agriculture sector of the State and about the relaxation of purchase tax in respect of Rubber, Coffee, Arecanut etc.

On November 15, 2001, Shri K. Sankaranarayanan, Minister for Finance and Excise made a statement under Rule 300 regarding the relief given to the export of rubber.

On November 22, 2001, Prof. K. V. Thomas, Minister for Fisheries and Tourism made a statement regarding the 'World Tourism Mart' held in London.

On December 5, 2001, Shri P. K. Kunhalikutty, Minister for Industries and Social Welfare made a statement regarding the I.T. Policy of the Government.

On December 6, 2001, Shri Babu Divakaran, Minister for Labour made a statement regarding the Labour Policy of the Government.

On the same date, Shri P. K. Kunhalikutty, Minister for Industries and Social Welfare made a statement regarding the Industrial policy of the Government.

Motion under Rule 130:

On December 7, 2001, Shri T. M. Jacob, Minister for Irrigation and Water Supply moved the following motion under Rule 130:

ജലവിതാനം ഉയർന്ന് ഡാമിന് എൻജിനീയറിംഗ് അപകടം സംഭവിച്ചാൽ അത്യന്തമൂലം ഇടക്കി, കോട്ടയം, എറണാകുളം എന്നീ ജില്ലകൾ അതിഭീകരമായ ദുരന്തത്തിനിരയാകുമെന്നതിനാലും;

സമീപകാലത്ത് ഈ മേഖലയിലുണ്ടായ മൂലമ്പനങ്ങൾക്കും ഉരുൾപൊട്ടലുകൾക്കുംശേഷം കേന്ദ്ര വിദഗ്ദ്ധ സമിതി ഇക്കാര്യത്തിൽ പ്രത്യേക പഠനങ്ങൾ നടത്തിയിട്ടില്ല എന്ന് തീർന്നുപോയി;

ജലനിരപ്പ്, നിലവിലുള്ള 136 അടിയിൽനിന്ന് ഉയർത്തിയാൽ കേരളത്തിലെ ഏക ടൈഗർ റിസർവ് ആയ പെരിയാർ വന മേഖലയിലെ 11.21 ചതുരശ്ര കിലോമീറ്റർ വനഭൂമികൃഷി മേഖലകളിൽ കുഞ്ഞുകയും തൻമൂലം അത്യപൂർവ്വമായ സസ്യജാലങ്ങളുടേയും ജന്തുവർഗ്ഗങ്ങളുടേയും നാശത്തിന് കാരണമാകുകയും അതിലുപരി വനത്തിലുള്ള ആദിവാസികളുടെ നിലനിൽപ്പിന് ഭീഷണിയാകുകയും ചെയ്യുമെന്നുള്ളതിനാലും;

മുഖ്യമന്ത്രിയർ ഡാമിലെ ജലനിരപ്പ് നിലവിലുള്ള 136 അടിയിൽ നിന്നും ഉയർത്താനുള്ള യാജനാർഹമായ നടപടികളും ഉണ്ടാകരുതെന്ന് ഈ സഭ കേന്ദ്ര-സംസ്ഥാന സർക്കാരുകളോട് ഐക്യകണ്ഠേണ അഭ്യർത്ഥിക്കുന്നു."

Statutory Resolutions:—

(1) On December 4, 2001, the following resolution moved by Shri Kadavoor Sivadasan, Minister for Electricity was adopted by the House without discussion.

"WHEREAS, sub-section (1) of Section 65 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 (Central Act 54 of 1948), empowers the State Electricity Board to borrow with the previous sanction of the State Government and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed in this behalf, any sum of money required for the purpose of the Act;

AND WHEREAS, sub-section (3) of the said section prescribe Ten Crores of rupees as the maximum amount which the Board may at any time have on loan unless the State Government with the approval of the State Legislative Assembly fixes a higher maximum amount;

AND WHEREAS, on the basis of the request made by the Kerala State Electricity Board as per resolution adopted by the State Legislative Assembly on 22-7-1999 the borrowing limit of the Board under sub-section (1) of section 65 of the said Act was fixed as Rupees Three Thousand Crores;

AND WHEREAS, the Kerala State Electricity Board has requested to enhance the borrowing limit of the Board under sub-section (1) of section 65 of the said Act to Rupees Seven Thousand and Five Hundred Crores;

AND WHEREAS, the Government proposes to fix the borrowing limit of the Kerala State Electricity Board under sub-section (1) of section 65 of the said Act as Rupees Six Thousand Crores; and to provide bulk guarantee to the tune of Rs. 1500 Crores;

Now, THEREFORE, the Legislative Assembly resolves to approve under sub-section (3) of section 65 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 (Central Act 54 of 1948) to fix the maximum borrowing limit of the Board under sub-section (1) of section 65 of the said Act as Rupees Six Thousand Crores and to provide bulk guarantee; to the tune of Rupees One Thousand and Five Hundred Crores".

(2) On December 7, 2001, the following resolution moved by Shri K. M. Mani, Minister for Revenue and Law under article 368 of the Constitution was adopted by the House;

"That this House ratifies the amendments to the Constitution of India falling within the purview of clauses (a) and (d) of the proviso to clause (2) of Article 368, proposed to be made by the Constitution (Ninety-first Amendment) Bill, 2000, as passed by the two Houses of Parliament".

(3) On December 7, 2001, the following resolution moved by Shri. K. Sankaranarayanan, Minister for Finance and Excise under Article 252 of the Constitution was adopted by the House;

"WHEREAS, the Kerala Legislative Assembly considers that it is desirable to have a uniform law throughout India for the regulation of Public Debt of the States and for all matters connected therewith or ancillary and incidental thereto;

AND WHEREAS, the subject matter of such a law is relatable mainly to the matter enumerated in entry 43 in List II in the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS, Parliament has no power to make such a law for the States with respect to the matter enumerated in entry 43 in List II aforesaid except as provided in Article 249 and 250 of the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS, the Public Debt Act, 1944 is applicable for marketable loans raised by Reserve Bank of India on behalf of both the Union and the State Governments;

AND WHEREAS, it is felt desirable to repeal the Public Debt Act, 1944 and replace the same with a new Legislation viz., "Government Securities Act" in order to enable the Reserve Bank of India to render efficient and improved service to the holders of Government Securities.

Now, THEREFORE, in pursuance of clause (1) of Article 252, this Assembly hereby resolves that the Parliament be empowered to regulate by law matters relating to Government securities and all other matters connected therewith or ancillary or incidental thereto in the State of Kerala".

Felicitations:—

On November 19, 2001, the Speaker made a statement felicitating the Kerala Football Team on their victory in the 57th Santhoshi Trophy Match.

Reference regarding the Amboori Tragedy:

On November 12, 2001, the Speaker made a reference regarding the landslide tragedy occurred at Amboori in Neyyattinkara Taluk on November 9, 2001. Shri A. K. Antony, Chief Minister, Shri V. S. Achuthanandan, Leader of Opposition and Sri Thampanoor Ravi associated themselves with the sentiments expressed by the Chair.

As a mark of respect to those who died in the tragedy, the Members stood in silence for a while.

Question of Breach of privilege:

The Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 2001 in respect of the Budget for the year 2001-2002 was introduced by the Minister for Finance on 31-10-2001. The Bill was taken up for consideration on the same day and was passed without discussion.

On November 23, 2001 the Minister for Finance laid the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2001-2002. Discussion and Voting on the Supplementary Demands for Grants took place on November 26, 2001. The Assembly devoted 4 hours and 12 minutes for the Business.

The Kerala Appropriation (No.3) Bill, 2001 in respect of Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2001-2002 was introduced in the Assembly on November, 27, 2001. The Bill was taken into consideration and passed on the same day. Nine Members including the Minister for Finance participated in the discussion.

APPENDIX—VI

SALIENT FEATURES OF THE BILLS PASSED

1. The Kerala Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 2001

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State and the grants made by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the Financial year 2001-2002.

2. The Kerala Finance Bill, 2001

The Bill seeks to amend the following enactments to give effect to certain financial proposals of the Government for the financial year 2001-2002, namely:—

1. The Kerala Money Lenders Act, 1958 (35 of 1958);
2. The Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 (15 of 1963);
3. The Kerala Tax on Luxuries Act, 1976 (35 of 1976);
4. The Kerala Agricultural Income Tax Act, 1991 (15 of 1991); and
5. The Kerala Tax on Entry of Goods into Local Areas Act, 1994 (15 of 1994).

3. The Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund Amendment Bill, 2001

In the Joint Conference of Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund Trustee Committee, members of the Bar Council and Presidents/Secretaries of all Bar Associations in the State of Kerala held on 20-12-1998, it was resolved *inter alia* to recommend enhancement of the Welfare Fund benefits to the Advocates under the Advocates' Welfare Fund by making necessary amendments to the Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund Act, 1980. Accordingly Government have decided to provide for payment of a sum of two lakhs rupees to the nominee or legal heirs of a member of the Fund, in case of death while in active practice and before he attains the age of 55 years, and to enhance the rate of amount payable to members on cessation of practice in such a way that the members having thirty two years of practice would get a maximum amount of three lakhs rupees.

2. In order to mobilise additional funds to meet the possible expenditure Government have also decided to enhance the rate of subscription of members to the Fund and the value of Advocates' Welfare Fund stamps to be affixed on vakalaths.

3. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and the proposal had to be given effect to immediately an Ordinance was promulgated by the Governor on the 18th day of November, 2000 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 16 of 2000, in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 2054 dated the 22nd November, 2000.

4. A Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of State Legislature, though published as Bill No. 282 of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 18th day of December, 2000 and ended on the 21st day of December, 2000. Therefore, in order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 16 of 2000, the Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor on the 28th day of January, 2001 and was published as Ordinance No. 5 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 153 dated the 28th January, 2001.

5. A Bill to replace Ordinance No. 5 of 2001 by an Act of the State Legislature was published as Bill No. 295 of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, but it could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 15th day of February, 2001 and ended on the 8th day of March, 2001 for want of time. Therefore, in order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 5 of 2001, the Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor on the 13th day of March, 2001 and was Published as Ordinance No. 14 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 367 dated the 13th March, 2001.

6. A Bill to replace Ordinance No. 14 of 2001 by an Act of the State Legislature could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 5th day of June, 2001 and ended on the 23rd day of July, 2001. Hence the Ordinance No. 14 of 2001 ceased to operate on the 17th day of July, 2001 under sub-clause (a) of clause (2) of Article 213 of the Constitution of India.

7. Though the Ordinance number 14 of 2001 has lapsed, the Government considered it necessary to keep the provisions of the said Ordinance alive.

8. As per section 15 of the Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund Act, 1980 an Advocate is eligible for membership in the Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund only if he is member of a Bar Association recognised by the Bar Council, Government considered it necessary that all the Advocates shall, irrespective of the fact whether they are members of the Bar Associations or not, be brought within the purview of the Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund by suitably amending the Act.

9. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and the above proposals had to be given effect to immediately, it was considered necessary to promulgate an Ordinance for the above purposes. Accordingly the Kerala Advocates' Welfare Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001, was promulgated by the Governor on the 5th day of September, 2001 and was published as Ordinance No. 33 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1295 dated the 5th day of September, 2001.

4. The Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Bill, 2001

Numerous proceedings are pending before the Land Tribunals, the Taluk Land Boards, the State Land Board, the Courts or the Revenue Authorities or other authorities wherein small land holders and cultivating tenants who purchased or otherwise acquired land for consideration, evidenced by registered documents or otherwise are under threat of eviction or dispossession.

2. Government are examining the feasibility of bringing comprehensive Amendment to the Kerala Land Reforms Act for protecting such small land holders and cultivating tenants from eviction and dispossession and also to protect their rights and interest on such lands. However, as difficulties would arise if such small land holders and cultivating tenants are evicted and dispossessed before enacting such a legislation, the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Act, 1999 (26 of 1999) was enacted giving a period of operation for two years from 31st March, 1999 for protecting such small land holders and cultivating tenants until enactment of the said legislation. The Governor has promulgated the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001 (26 of 2001) on the 13th March, 2001, extending the period of operation of the said law for one year from the 31st March 2001.

3. However, an Act to replace the said Ordinance could not be passed in the session of the Legislative Assembly which commenced from the 5th June 2001 and ended on the 23rd July, 2001. Therefore, the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Ordinance, 2001 (32 of 2001) was promulgated on the 4th September, 2001 providing for protecting the rights and interests of the aforesaid small land holders and cultivating tenants on such lands and for removing difficulties that would have arisen due to the expiry of Ordinance No. 26 of 2001. A Bill to replace the Ordinance has to be introduced in, and passed within six weeks from the re-Assembly of the Legislature under sub-clause (b) of clause (2) of Article 213 of the Constitution.

4. As the steps to amend the Kerala Land Reforms Act is not yet completed, the Government consider it necessary to pass an Act by replacing Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Ordinance, 2001 (32 of 2001) and by giving effect to the provision of the Ordinance upto the 30th March 2002.

5. The Bill is intended to achieve the above purpose.

5. The Kerala Road Fund Bill, 2001

The State Government is responsible for the development and maintenance of the main frame arterial road network in the State. Road development is currently funded substantially through the traditional source of funding from Governments budgetary resources. The level of this funding is far short of the requirements of maintenance as laid down in the standards prescribed by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways. Not only is such funding inadequate for maintenance but also capital fund provisions for widening, rehabilitation and reconstruction to bring roads to required levels of technical standards are inadequate. While the traffic on state highways has been growing at a rapid pace it has not been possible for the State Government to provide the necessary funds owing to competing demands from other priority sectors. This has resulted in deficiencies in the road network. Many sections of the state highways are in need of capacity augmentation by way of widening, grade separation construction of bypasses, bridges and expressways, etc. and many bridges are in need of replacement.

2. Government had proposed to create a separate Road fund for the development and maintenance of roads owned and maintained by the State Public Works Department. Suitable legislation was necessary for the implementation of the proposal. Considering the constrained resource availability of the State and in the light of the Government's policy to encourage private participation in infrastructure sectors it was also proposed to create a statutory framework for the purpose.

3. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the Kerala Road Fund Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor on the 7th day of September, 2001, and it was published as Ordinance No. 34 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette, Extraordinary No. 1301 dated 7th September, 2001.

4. The Bill seeks to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

6. The Kerala Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Bill, 2001

Section 271 G, as included in the Kerala Panchayat Raj Act, 1994 (by the Kerala Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Act, 1999 (13 of 1999) provided for constituting an authority of Ombudsman having 7 members for making investigations and inquiries in respect of allegations on any action involving corruption or maladministration or irregularities in the discharge of administrative functions by Local Self Government institutions and public servants working under them. State Planning Board has recorded the opinion that the

Ombudsman constituted under the said section could not win the confidence of the common man or to control corruption, and it has complex procedures similar to that of Courts and that Government have been incurring additional financial commitment by way of giving salaries and other benefits equivalent to that of High Court Judges, and when compared with the nature of work which has to be done, this huge expenditure is not justifiable and none of the aims and objects of this institution has been fulfilled in the case of the existing State Ombudsman. In this circumstance, it has been decided to appoint a person who held the office of the High Court Judge as one Man Ombudsman. For this purpose, it has been decided to make amendments to Sections 271 F, 271 G, 271 H, 271 N and 271 R of the Kerala Panchayat Raj Act, 1994. As the Legislative Assembly of the State was not in session and as circumstances existed which rendered it necessary to make immediate legislation to give effect to the aforesaid decision, the Kerala Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Ordinance 2001 was promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 13th day of September, 2001 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 36 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1355 of 14th September, 2001.

7. The University Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2001

The declared policy of the Government is to convert Kerala into a major Information Technology destination of India. The Government also propose to launch a programme to generate adequate number of trained Information Technology Professionals by setting up centers of Excellence in Information Technology Sector in collaboration with the private sector. It has also been decided to develop Kerala as a model E-Governance State in the country. To this end, Information Technology will have to be made use of to increase efficiency in all sectors including Schools and Universities. Similarly, Bio-technology is another emerging branch of knowledge which requires special attention in the field of University education. As a first step towards achieving the above said objects it is proposed to strengthen the administrative authorities of the affiliating Universities in the State by nominating adequate number of persons having knowledge and experience in the fields of Information Technology and Bio-Technology to the Senates and Syndicates of these Universities. For enabling the Government to make the nomination to the Senate and Syndicate of the Kerala University, the Calicut University and the Mahatma Gandhi University the respective enactments, namely, the Kerala University Act, 1974 the Calicut University Act, 1975 and the Mahatma Gandhi University Act, 1985 have to be amended suitably.

As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately, the University Laws (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor on the 13th day of September, 2001 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 35 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1356 dated 14th September, 2001.

8. The Kannur University (Amendment) Bill, 2001

As per section 97 of the Kannur University, 1996, the University was explicitly prohibited from granting affiliation to unaided colleges. But the other affiliating Universities in the State are empowered to affiliate unaided colleges. The Government however considered it necessary to encourage the setting up of unaided colleges in the State to meet the very high demand for higher education especially professional education. Hence it was proposed to take away this prohibition on affiliation of unaided colleges. It was also proposed to empower the Government to determine the service conditions of the teaching and non-teaching staff of unaided colleges and matters relating to the admission of students and fees payable in such colleges. In order to achieve these objects an amendment to the Kannur University Act, 1996 was necessary.

As the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was not in session and as the proposals had to be given effect to immediately, the Kannur University (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001, was promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 28th day of August, 2001 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 31 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1281 dated 28th August, 2001.

Eventhough the Kannur University was established in the year 1995, it received only academic recognition from the University Grants Commission. The University Grants Commission has not declared the University fit to receive the financial assistance from the Commission. Both recognition and financial assistance by the University Grants Commission are indispensable for the proper and efficient functioning of the University. The Government have assured the University Grants Commission that necessary changes would be made in the University Act in accordance with the guidelines of the Commission. Therefore it is proposed to modify the constitution and powers of the Senate and Syndicate of the University accordingly. It is also proposed to dissolve the existing Senate and Syndicate and reconstitute the same in accordance with the modified constitution. An amendment to the Act is necessary for this purpose.

9. The Kerala appropriation (No. 3) Bill, 2001

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204(1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 2001-2002.

10. The Pariyaram Medical College and Hospital (Transfer for Administration) Bill, 2001

For the improvement of Medical facilities in the northern part of the State and for establishing a Medical College in the Co-operative sector, a Co-operative Society known as the Kerala State Co-operative Hospital Complex and Centre for Advanced Medical Services Ltd., and a Society known as Academy of Medical Sciences, Pariyaram, Kannur were established with Government participation.

2: In G.O. (MS) No. 293/94/RD dated the 19th May, 1994 an extent of 48.1562 hectares of land comprised in R.S. No. 256/7 of Kadannappally Village in Kannur District was assigned by the Government to the Kerala State Co-operative Hospital Complex and Centre for Advanced Medical Services Ltd.

3: For the purpose of obtaining permission to the societies for establishing the Pariyaram Medical College from the Medical Council of India and the Central Government, the Government of Kerala have executed an undertaking that it will not takeover the management or acquire the Pariyaram Medical College after its establishment. On the basis of the said undertaking, the Medical Council of India and the Central Government have granted permission to the Academy of Medical Sciences for establishing the Pariyaram Medical College.

4: The Academy of Medical Sciences and the Co-operative Hospital Complex have established the Pariyaram Medical College and Hospital and started functioning with effect from the academic year 1994-95. The management of the Academy of Medical Sciences and the Co-operative Hospital Complex was taken over by the Government for a limited period under the Kerala Co-operative Hospital Complex and the Academy of Medical Sciences (Taking over the management) Act, 1997 (6 of 1997) with effect from the 9th day of February, 1997. The period of taking over the management of the two societies by Government was due to expire on the 9th day of February, 2001. Before the expiry of the period of taking over the management of the societies by the Government, the Pariyaram Medical College and Hospital were acquired by the Government under the provisions of the Pariyaram Institute of Medical Sciences and Advanced Studies in Tuberculosis and Chest Diseases Ordinance, 2000 (19 of 2000). In order to keep alive the provisions of the said Ordinance, Ordinance numbers 12 of 2001 and 22 of 2001 were promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 28th day of January, 2001, and the 13th day of March, 2001 respectively. After the promulgation of the aforesaid Ordinance the Medical Council of India has withdrawn the recognition to the Pariyaram Medical College.

5. Government will have to incur unaffordable amount by way of compensation to the societies for the transfer and vesting in Government on the basis of the market value of the establishment, determined as per the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance. The societies have represented that they are willing to provide all the required facilities to the Medical College, as specified by the Medical Council of India, for reviving the recognition to the said College during the current academic year of 2001-2002, if the Pariyaram Medical College and Hospital are transferred to them. In the interest of the public and in the interest of the students studying in the Pariyaram Medical College and with a view to ensuring better facilities for the medical education and medical facilities in the northern part of the State, it was decided to entrust the administration of the Pariyaram Medical College and Hospital to the societies.

11. The Kerala Agricultural University (Amendment) Bill, 2001

Government intend to convert the Kerala Agricultural University as a research institution and to reconstitute its governing body to make it capable of directing research and allied works for increasing productivity, diversification etc. in the field of agriculture. In order to reduce unnecessary expenditure and to make the statutory bodies more efficient and effective to advice and assist the University in the performance of its research and academic work, amendments in the Kerala Agricultural University Act, 1971 are necessary. It is also proposed to provide for ensuring audit of accounts of the University by the Accountant General of the Director of Local Fund Audit within the time limit prescribed therefore.

2. This Bill seeks to achieve the above object.

12. The Kerala Agricultural Debtors (Temporary Relief) Bill, 2001

The benefits conferred by the Kerala Agriculturists Debt Relief Act, 1970 (11 of 1970) are available only in respect of debts incurred by the Agriculturists, before the 14th day of July, 1970 on which date the said Act came into force.

2. The Agricultural indebtedness in the State continued to be on the increase due to various factors. The plight of agriculturists is further worsened by the fall in prices of most of the agricultural commodities and the wide spread debilitating diseases of major crops like coconut, pepper and cashew over the last five years. The recent flood and earthquakes in various parts of the State have also added to the misery of these agriculturists.

3. Further, several suits and other proceedings have been filed in Courts, Tribunals and other authorities for the recovery of debts incurred by such agriculturists. In the Governor's Address to the Legislative Assembly on 29th June 2001, it was announced that debt relief to agriculturist will be given by enacting proper legislative measures.

4. Considering all the above aspects Government have decided to provide temporary relief to those agriculturists whose total Principal amount of debts do not exceed fifty thousand rupees.

5. This Bill is intended to achieve the above object.

13. **The Kerala Handloom Workers' Welfare Fund (Amendment) Bill, 2001**

Each Handloom worker has to pay one Rupee per month and each employed person has to pay two rupees per month as contribution to the Handloom Workers' Welfare Fund under sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Kerala Handloom Workers' Welfare Fund Act, 1989. Under sub-section (2) of the said section each dealer has to pay an amount equivalent to one per cent of his one month's total sale proceeds towards contribution to the fund. Under sub-section (3) of the said section each employer and producer of handloom products including co-operative societies have to pay, an amount equivalent to one year's contribution paid by the workers engaged by them, as contribution to the fund every year. Under sub-section (4) of the said section Government have to pay to the fund every year an amount equal to twice the amount contributed by the handloom workers and self employed persons in a year.

2. As it is felt that the amount now contributed by the handloom workers and self employed persons are low the Government have decided to enhance it to Rs. 3 and Rs. 5 respectively.

3. The dealers were constantly demanding for an amendment as the contribution payable to the fund by a dealer is very high and they were showing reluctance to remit the contribution. As a result, acute shortage in the payment of contribution towards the fund badly affected the working of the Board. In order to overcome this it has been decided to fix the contribution rates on slab basis in accordance with their annual sale proceeds instead of the existing one per cent of annual sale proceeds.

4. While increasing the contribution payable per month by every handloom worker and self employed person to three rupees and five rupees respectively, the Government would also have to pay more amount as contribution to the fund in conformity with it. Considering the difficulties of the Government to undertake more liability for a particular class of workers alone, Government

decided that the contribution payable by the Government will be equal to such amount instead of twice the amount contributed by the handloom workers and self employed persons in a year.

5. As per sub-section (1) of Section 11 of the Kerala Handloom Workers' Welfare Fund Act, 1989 the Board shall authorise only an officer not below the rank of a Deputy Labour Officer to determine the amount due from every employer or dealer or producer of handloom products. But due to non-availability of officers not below the rank of District Labour Officer of the Labour Department or Officers of equal rank from other Departments circumstances existed that the post of District Executive Officers were lying vacant and the functions of the Board were affected. Considering these circumstances it was also decided to amend the Act so as to enable the Board to authorise an officer not below the rank of an Assistant Labour Officer in Labour Department or an Officer of an equal rank from other Departments for determining the amount due to the Fund.

6. As the Legislative Assembly of the State of Kerala was not in Session and as circumstances existed which rendered it necessary to take immediate action to give effect to the aforesaid decision, the Kerala Handloom Workers' Welfare Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor of Kerala on the 13th day of March 2001 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 19 of 2001 in the Extraordinary Gazette No. 372 of 13th day of March, 2001.

7. A Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature could not be introduced in, and passed by, in the First Session of the Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly which commenced on the 5th day of June, 2001 and ended on the 23rd day of July, 2001. Hence the said Ordinance ceased to operate on the 17th day of July, 2001 under sub-clause (a) of clause (2) of Article 213 of the Constitution of India.

14. The Guruvayoor Devaswom (Amendment) Bill, 2001

As per section 4 of the Guruvayoor Devaswom Act, 1978, the Guruvayoor Devaswom Managing Committee shall consist of the following members, namely:—

- (d) representative of the Guruvayoor Devaswom employees nominated by the Hindus, among the Council of Ministers.
- (e) not more than 5 persons nominated by the Hindus among the Council of Ministers.

2. The Guruvayoor Devaswom Act, 1978 was amended in 1998 whereby the term of the members, nominated under clause (d) and (e) was enhanced from two years to four years, so as to enable the said Committee to properly implement the projects decided by it. It is felt that the enhancement of the term of the nominated members, did not give the desired result. So, the Government have decided to reduce the term of Office of the nominated members of the Committee, as two years.

3. As per sub-section (4) of section 6 of the Act when the Committee is superseded for a period not exceeding six months, the Guruvayoor Devaswom Commissioner will hold the charge of the Committee. But the Act is silent as to what should be done when there is delay to constitute committee or when the Committee is unable to function due to some other reasons. Therefore it has been decided to insert a new provision as section 6A, for the purpose.

4. It is also felt that for the effective functioning of the Committee, at least one member each from the permanent members as well as nominated members should attend the meeting of the Committee which could be achieved by enhancing the quorum as four. The Government have therefore, decided to amend section 7 of the Act accordingly.

5. This Bill seeks to amend the Act to achieve the above objects.

15. The Kerala protection of river Banks and regulation of removal of sand Bill, 2001

It has come to the notice of the Government that indiscriminate and uncontrolled removal of sand from the rivers cause large scale river bank sliding and loss of property and coastal erosion. Uncontrolled dredging of sand also disturbs the bio-physical environment system of the river in different degrees. The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in its interim order dated 26-3-2001 in O.P. No. 16272/2000 have also observed the necessity for imposing conditions for sand removal for protecting the rivers in the State. It is also noticed that the existing executive orders imposing restrictions on sand removal creates hardship to the employees engaged in this field and also adversely affects the construction sector due to shortage of river sand.

Considering all the aspects of the matter, Government have decided to bring in a new legislation to provide for certain regulations on sand removal so as to protect the river and river banks and to conserve the bio-physical environment.

The Bill seeks to achieve the above objects.
